2016 CCA of the Year — Bill Brooks

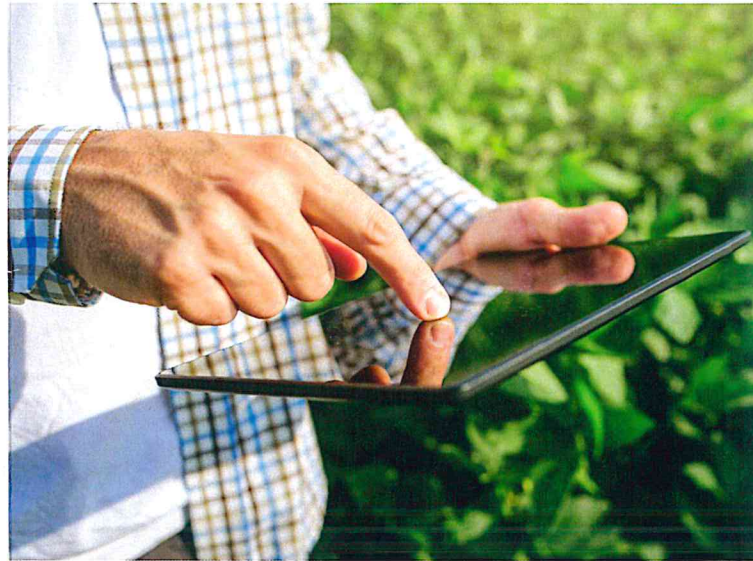
